1. **Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare (Dec 1998 to May 2008)** (continued)

- The webMethods Integration Platform being the departments preferred choice as an Enterprise Services Bus, we have Architected interfaces between most of the departments major applications such as **COMPASS, CIS, HCSIS, CCMIS, LIHEAP, PROMISE, CAPS, CWDS** etc as well as between inter-agency applications with agencies such as **IES, DOH, L&I, JNET** etc.

2. **Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare (June 2000 to July 2003)**

- Develop, test, document, and install utilities written using SSG and IPF on Unisys Mainframes of the 2200/ClearPath family of Enterprise Servers.
